News From the Groups

Group No. No.49 The Enlightenment or the Age of Reason Wednesdays, 10.30 – 12.00, MCC

"Enlightenment is the period of European thought characterised by the emphasis on experience and reason, mistrust of religion and traditional authority, and a gradual emergence of the ideals of liberal, secular, democratic societies." Most of its representatives lived in the 18th century: Voltaire, Hume, Rousseau, Mendelssohn, Jefferson, Paine, Wollstonecroft, Kant, etc. They were philosophers, politicians,

economists, lawyers, writers, Encyclopédistes, activists, even kings and presidents. They started a new way of looking at our world. Their way of thinking and the subjects of their thinking have influenced the centuries after them. Over the time of the course we shall hopefully find out why we are thinking what we are thinking today.

Each of the sessions will feature one or more personalities and the matter they were concerned about, e.g. tolerance, independence, human rights, education, etc.; they will be connected like a network, but each session is a unit on its own.

The first session on 27 September will be an introduction and overview. It will be an opportunity to start discussing a number of questions. If you are still looking for a course, you are very welcome! Esther

I know you not, but you are in my seed. From son to son my Lion is now in you. In Black Watch cloth I fell with stripe on sleeve, But look not here 'midst rows in Cab'ret Rouge.

Where am I now - a thought by kith and kin? Your tears, long dry, were never felt for me. The loss stirred doubts of "self", there lies your pain, And death's grave grip holds all and none are free.

When guns go quiet, and war's no more a thought, In Heav'n we'll meet, how peace is dearly bought.

Robert Wingate, son of Robert Wingate and grandson of lance-corporal Robert Wingate of the 8th Battalion of the Black Watch, who was killed in action on the Somme on 14th September 1916 and who lives on in fading memory. The poem is dedicated to him.

BU RESEARCH UPDATE

Back in covid days, when most weekly groups were in hibernation, our u3a was asked for volunteers to take part in a BU research project. The EU funded project wanted to hear our suggestions about our own anticipated homecare needs that would allow us to remain at home for as long as possible.

Those of us who took part had semi-structured interviews with Mavis Bengtsson, by Zoom, over a number of weeks. She then went away, transcribed our qualitative research interviews, and analysed our responses with appropriate academic methods.

At the beginning of August, I caught up with Mavis over coffee. She told me that the project was now completed, and she had passed the conclusions on to the person leading the Integrated Care Strategy for One Dorset. I congratulated Mavis on the award of her doctorate from BU for this research.

Her general conclusions were (i) that we sought wellbeing and dignity in our later years, and (ii) that we looked forward to proactive homecare delivered by trustworthy homecare providers. Highlights of Tuscany July 2023

Sunshine and sunflowers in glorious Tuscan countryside! U3A members spent two delightful weeks in the lovely spa town of *Montecatini Terme*. Its proximity to *Florence, Lucca, Prato, Pisa and Volterra* made it a splendid base for sightseeing, but with temperatures reaching 38 degrees we were glad to cool off afterwards in the hotel swimming pool before indulging in a four-course dinner.

Sightseeing highlights included the beautiful gardens of *Villa Marlia*, followed by lunch at the medieval hilltop village of *San Gennaro*. The parish church there is home to a terracotta statue attributed to Leonardo da Vinci.

Collodi, birthplace of the author of *Pinocchio*, provided a theme park and we upped the cultural ante with a visit to *Volterra*, well prepared beforehand by a lecture on the Etruscans from Dante, the hotel owner. We visited *San Gimignano*, with its fourteen 13th century stone towers, en route home.

Our understanding of Tuscan wine was enhanced in special wine tasting sessions run by Nicoletta, one of the hotel family members. Taking small groups of 8 people she took us through wine growing from vineyard to finished product. We sampled a white wine and two red wines, accompanied by the appropriate food over a leisurely lunch hour.

Musical opportunities included local concerts at *Terme Tettuccio* by visiting choirs and orchestras hailing from Australia and Cork; extracts from Puccini operas at *Lucca* and a full open-air performance of *La Boheme* at *Torre del Lago*. Still hot at midnight!

A truly magical fortnight with many thanks to Margaret Ronchetti for sharing her love of Tuscany with us and making it happen.
